ST ALOYSIUS GONZAGA



The College is named after Saint Aloysius Gonzaga. He was a prince in Italy, in the 16th century. He had everything he could have desired in life. But, inspired by a deep spirit of faith and love for fellow persons, he abdicated his rights, at the age of 18. He entered the Jesuit Order to be a religious, whose wealth would be God alone and whose happiness would be the service of others. While Aloysius was still under training, there was a plague in Rome. Victims of the plague were being abandoned everywhere for fear of contagion. Youthful Aloysius who was then 24, with his companions immediately set about caring for the abandoned, sick and the dying, risking his own health. The risk, however, was too great and Aloysius fell ill and died at the age of 25 in the midst of his noble work offering his life as a sacrifice for others.

His example of pure and noble life, not seeking the glories of this world, genuine concern for the welfare of others is proposed to you as a model, in this institution.

Our task is the moulding of integral personality, where your faculties and qualities will find human, intellectual, physical and spiritual development.

INTELLECTUAL DEVELOPMENT

The development of your mind, the gathering of information in the different subjects of your study, digesting this information and putting it into a practical framework will be the major part of your education here. Let your aim of study be not just to successfully reproduce in an examination what you have learnt but to cultivate the art of thinking for yourself, of thinking analytically and critically and expressing yourself clearly.

Regular work camps of the NCC, the NSS help you to develop and cultivate, physical endurance, team spirit, fair play, punctuality, along with good habits of health and hygiene.

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

This is an institution run by a religious group. Highest importance is given to spiritual formation and character development. The moral and spiritual values, learnt in this institution will guide you for life.

Education in the college is the period when you have to build up your value system: justice, cooperation, fellowship and concern for others, belief in and filial devotion to God and a universal love that embraces all people cutting across barriers of religion, caste and language.

You have regular programmes in value education to learn and develop such value system. Perhaps you will absorb your values from your companions and elders while you yourself will be influencing the value system of others.

Self discipline is essential to any spiritual and value formation. The rules of discipline will help you cultivate interior self- discipline in the college, if you internalize them in the right spirit.

It is vitally important to identify the forces of injustice and exploitation in society and respond to the situation adequately. To evoke such adequate response, we need people who are socially conscious, genuinely find meaning to life, by being at the service of others even at the cost of their lives: men and women for others.

If our students cultivate such a heart and move out of this Institution imbued with a sense of social concern, ready to stake their lives for the poor and the oppressed, then alone the College will have succeeded in its mission and genuinely be proud of its work.

Towards this integral development of body, mind and heart we have certain helps to offer you: the help of our Staff and our counseling services.

STAFF-STUDENT RAPPORT

Today, more than ever, closer ties between staff and students are the only way to counteract many problems arising from the impersonal atmosphere prevailing in much of our college education. This would of course, mean that you are willing to be guided by your teachers.

This staff-student rapport will be all the more effective if parents co-operate and keep in touch with the College and staff. As a help towards this, the College brings together parents and teachers with specific programmes which would assist parents with insights into the problems of growing youngsters like you.

Many of our staff members have undergone training to help you not only with your academic difficulties but also with your personal and emotional problems. You may always approach them for guidance, not only to help you solve your problems but also to help you become more effective in the way you function. All the batches will be given a Class Guide who will meet his/her wards regularly and also conduct well-planned programmes to give them self confidence, healthy interpersonal relationships and effective utilization of their talents and abilities.

COUNSELING SERVICES

Counseling service is provided to the students and to the parents. Students may seek help from the Counselors for a variety of concerns including living up to the college curriculum, improving relationship with family, friends, room-mates, making important decisions about ones personal life, dealing with painful feelings like loneliness, depression etc.,

Counseling services are confidential. Students will have to meet their respective counselors on regular basis. Parents may seek help from the counselors on how to motivate their children, build up self confidence, healthy personal relationship and prospective studies.

PLEASE TAKE SPECIAL NOTE

- * Ragging is a major offence. Those who indulge in ragging, even in a 'friendly' way, or encourage ragging, will face immediate dismissal from the College. No Justification in this regard is acceptable.
- Without the explicit permission of the Principal, no picnics, send-off parties, get-togethers, either in the campus or in any other place, are to be organized. No overnight picnics are allowed. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate these rules.
- Students should wear prescribed uniform to attend classes in the college. Students with indecent apparels will be severely reprimanded and will be asked to leave the college campus.
- Students who have difficulty in any particular subject are recommended to approach the lecturers for help. They are also to attend remedial classes organized for such students in the college premises.
- * 75% attendance in each subject is compulsory, to be eligible for the PUC board examinations. Attendance will be considered till the last working day.
- * If your progress in studies is unsatisfactory you will not be permitted to appear for the PUC final examinations.
- * Marks cards of every exam will be either handed over to the parents or sent to them by mail. Marks of all the tests and exams will be sent through sms to the parents.

Use and possession of mobile phone is strictly prohibited within the college campus. If any student is found using mobile, such handset will be confiscated and will not be returned.

- Students should spend their free hours in the library and not loiter around or sit chatting in the classroom.
- Students initiating or indulging in any kind of violence inside or outside the college premises will pay dismissal from the college.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. Classes are conducted between 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on all working days from Monday to Saturday. Extra curricular activities, remedial classes and spoken English will be taken from 3:15 p.m to 4:30 p.m.
- 2. Five minutes before the hour fixed for each session, the first warning bell for commencement of class, is given. The teachers then enter the classroom and the students stand in respectful silence to receive them and commence the class.
- 3. At the stroke of the bell for the first hour in the morning, all pray in silence to obtain God's light and help in the work before them. When the attendance is called out, each one rises and answers to his / her name.
- 4. Late comers can enter the class only if permitted by the lecturer. They may be marked present at the end of the hour, only if there is sufficient reason for being late. Those who depend on public conveyance to come to College, should leave their homes early to avoid peak hours and reach the College on time for classes.
- 5. During class, lecturer's permission is needed to move away from one's place or to leave the class room.
- 6. Punctuality and regular attendance is essential for the formation of character and therefore it is insisted upon. Permission for leave

- of absence from college, should be obtained from the concerned authority.
- 7. Unforeseen absence must be justified on return, with a note of excuse signed by the parents or guardian, before entering the class. A medical certificate should be furnished especially when a student is absent for a long time, due to illness. A medical certificate however does not entitle a student for attendance, during the absence. The names of students who are absent continuously for two weeks without any notice, will be struck off from the register.
- 8. Those who are deputed officially by the college to participate in Academic, Cultural, Sports Activities etc. should hand over to the Class Guide a note of deputation signed by the teachers concerned.
- 9. Strict action will be taken if the students absent themselves during college examinations and for being absent once the college reopens. In case of illness, a medical certificate should be furnished. Parents have a duty to inform if their ward is absent for any examination.
- 10. Irregularity in attendance, insubordination to the staff members, habitual inattention, late coming, neglect of work, obscenity in word or act, are punishable by permanent or temporary dismissal from the college. Minor offences are punishable by a fine or loss of attendance.
- 11. The College does not hold itself responsible for the conduct of its students outside its premises. However, it takes cognizance of any serious misconduct of its students committed outside its precincts. Should any serious charge be fairly substantiated, the guilty shall be punished according to the gravity of the offence.
- 12. Progress reports of students will be issued after every test and exam. They will be either handed over to the parents in person or will be mailed to them.
- 13. Based on the performance in the terminal examinations, the applications of the students whose progress is not satisfactory, will not be recommended to the PUC board, for examinations by it.

- 14. Students attending class or other gatherings within the college are expected to be neatly dressed, in according with the rules of approved etiquette.
- 15. Every student must greet the members of the Staff on the occasion of his/her first meeting for the day.
- 16. Books, Magazines, newspapers etc., not approved by the Principal, are not allowed to be brought to the College.
- 17. Every student should posses an identity card issued by the College which should be produced whenever asked for, especially when dealing with the office and library.
- 18. We do not wish to see any student consuming alcohol or using tobacco in any form in the College premises. If any student chooses to do so, they will be summarily dismissed from the College.
- 19. Students are required to live either with their relatives or guardians or in a hostel or lodging house or rooms approved by the College authorities. Residing in hotels is discouraged.
- 20. Students must not be in any club or society or make any engagements that may interfere with their studies without the Principal's permission. They are not allowed to play in any team against the College.
- 21. Students are not allowed to take part in political agitation directed against the authority of the Government. They are also forbidden to engage prominently in any public movement without permission from the Principal. They are further desired to observe all the disciplinary regulations which the management may frame from time to time, in this regard.
- 22. Letters officially addressed to the Principal should enclose reply postage. Only official letters will be handed over to the students. Private letters will be redirected to the home or hostel address.
- 23. Attendance at classes and examinations, progress, as well as the conduct of the student, will be taken into consideration, while

- recommending any student for certificate of merit, fee concessions, scholarships, higher studies, job interviews etc.
- 24. Students are not authorized to collect donations from the public for any of the College activity without the permission of the Principal.
- 25. Students are not permitted to celebrate any religious festivals within the College campus without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 26. Students are not permitted to bring or use cellular phones, mobile phones and pagers to the college campus.
- 27. Attendance at Value Education classes and examinations is obligatory to all the students.
- 28. Students who do not have 75% of the required attendance cannot appear for the final examination as per the PU Board regulations.
- 29. Students are to use the internet lab only during the prescribed hour.
- 30. I PUC students who are indulging in malpractice in the College Exams will not be admitted to II PUC. Students of II PUC indulging in any malpractice will not be allowed to appear for the final examination of II PUC.
- 31. Students who steal or rob, will be dismissed from the College.
- 32. Students are not permitted to bring self-driven vehicles to the college.
- 33. Books, articles, etc. should have a name or mark by which the owner can be easily identified. All stray or unclaimed property found in the college, should be brought to the Vice Principal's office.

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WHAT IS OUTREACH?

The Jesuit view of Higher education has never been a simplistic and one-sided one. It concerns all round development with a special focus on critical praxis that engages students to yoke their academic excellence, their character development and their personal concern to the transformation of a society deeply disturbed by inequality and injustice. The student that passes through Jesuit higher education cannot remain isolated from the economic, political and cultural fabric of his/her society. It is integral to higher education that he/she becomes aware of and is involved in the everyday realities of the society. It is the Jesuit ideal that solidarity with the people can only be achieved by 'contact' and 'participation' in the daily life of the marginalized. It is therefore the firm conviction of Jesuit Higher Education that 'personal involvement with innocent suffering, with the injustice others suffer, is the catalyst for solidarity which then gives rise to intellectual inquiry and moral reflection'.

In alignment with the Jesuit Higher Education purposes, the University Grants Commission, the Highest Education Authority in India, has recognized the relevance and importance of the purpose and practice of 'Extension' as integral to the process of learning. Hence it expects universities and colleges, given their knowledge, human resources and infrastructure, to become positive change- makers who would empower the marginalized of society.

WHY OUTREACH?

The Outreach programme draws its inspiration from the college's vision of forming men and women for and with others. It will provide students with a platform to explore and develop the art of critical thinking, the skills of leadership and techniques of meaningful interventions aimed at building a just and equitable society. It further draws its roots from the Brazilian educator Paulo Freire's Philosophy of Action-Reflection- Praxis.

In view of the UGC and the NAAC recommendations on Extension, the objective of the outreach programme is to extend knowledge and other institutional resources to the community and vice-versa. It is a two- way process between the institution and the people, and intellectual intervention in the community's living problems which need to be overcome through an educational process. Extension is a perfect blend of theory with practice.

It will orient the students with skills required in community development and would sensitize them towards various issues of these marginalized groups and instill enough confidence and satisfaction for taking up the cause of the development of those groups.

As the name of the programme, SPANDANA itself suggests, with the poor, it aims in creating young men and women whose heart vibrates to create opportunities for education, awareness and skill enhancement for the deprived groups and vulnerable sections of the society. It intends to create a learning process for faculty and students, through exposure to community needs, problems, and issues. It hopes to reach out to the community by designing need based interventions and generating research.

Eventually it will facilitate networking and linkages of the community with NGOs, institutions, and government agencies for the effective service delivery and advocacy support. It also hopes to link up with the corporate sector within the parameters of Corporate Social Responsibilities (CSR).

STRUCTURE AND PROCESS

There are two stages in the Outreach Programme:

1. The preparation Stage: In this stage students will be equipped with the required knowledge, through HRD Classes, Talks and Documentaries. In this process students will be able to identify student leaders, and the leaders will also undergo a special training to lead the class for the outreach activity.




